Introduction to Career Education:	A person's career is considered their "journey" through life, and the Career Education curriculum offers students the opportunity to pursue this journey in personally meaningful and goal-oriented ways. Career-life development with intent is the ongoing process of self-discovery, growth in competence, and learning from experiences in educational, work-related, and personal life contexts. The Career Education curriculum supports students in becoming successful, educated citizens by helping them learn how to effectively manage their life journey toward preferred future possibilities. This area of learning requires students to identify and develop their personal interests, passions, and competencies. Students reflect on learning experiences in school and community, build confidence through their contributions, and explore multiple career-life roles and choices. The curriculum fosters lifelong learning, beginning in kindergarten and continuing through to graduation and beyond.

Let's Get Started

- 1. Students visit www.myBlueprint.ca/sd83, and click on SCHOOL Account Log In
 - Enter your SD 83 log in credentials and click Sign In.

NOTE: You should be participating in school-based Career activities/presentations or fieldtrips throughout the year (various Trades Spotlights and Post-Secondary Institute tours). When you have completed an activity, create a box in your "About Me" grade 10 portfolio, with the title of the specific activity. Add a reflection on what you have learned during this activity. Listen carefully to the morning announcement for information about upcoming Trade activities.

OCTOBER

NOTE: The **Learning Styles**, **Personality**, **and Interests** assessments must be completed before a student can complete the Compatibility surveys. They need to be added to your About Me portfolio and reflections added for each.

ACTIVITY #1: Knowledge Assessment

- 1. Select Portfolios from the tab menu in the home section.
- 2. Add a new portfolio (+ Add Portfolio) titled "About Me Portfolio" -Description Grade 10! This portfolio will allow you to showcase your interests, passions, goals, and career interest.
 - *Each grade year students will create an About Me portfolio for that particular grade/year.
- 3. Select Who Am I? From the left-hand navigation menu on your dashboard.
- 4. Complete ONLY the **Knowledge** survey to receive your results.
- 5. Review the **full report** to learn more about your top two motivation factors and the types of opportunities that are well suited to your interests.
- 6. Add your Knowledge to your About Me Portfolio.
- **7.** Write a brief **reflection** (What did you learn?).

ACTIVITY #2: Goal Setting for Term 1

- 1. Select Home from the navigation menu on the left-hand side of your screen. Then select the tab Goals.
- 2. Add ONE (1) Academic Goal (short term, term 1) and include an Action Plan for how you intend to achieve it. This can be around learning a new skill or to improve on a specific subject area.
- 3. Add this academic goal to your About Me Portfolio.
- 4. Add ONE (1) Other Goal (short term) and include an Action Plan for how you intend to achieve it. This can be about anything else in your life that you would like to improve on.
- 5. Add this goal to your About Me Portfolio.

NOVEMBER

- 2. Add 2 custom boxes (click + Add Box, Add Media +) titled "My Summer" and upload a picture or video of something that you did this summer. One box sharing a summer event/activity that you experienced, another box sharing something or somewhere you hope you get to participate in or experience next summer.
- 3. Add a title and a description.
- 4. Add a reflection (Explain your additions).



DECEMBER

ACTIVITY #1: Goal Setting for Term 2

- 1. Select Home from the navigation menu on the left-hand side of your screen. Then select the tab Goals.
- **2.** Go to your About Me Portfolio write a reflection on the progress of your goals you set for term 1. Were you successful, what worked, what didn't, would you change anything?
- 3. If you have achieved your term 1 goal, please add a new Academic Goal (one, short term, term 2) and include an Action Plan for how you intend to achieve it. This can be around learning a new skill or to improve on a specific subject area. If you have NOT achieved your goal from term 1, your reflection should include a comment regarding your progress, any change in your "plan of attack", and any additional steps required to meet your target.
- **4.** Add this academic goal to your **About Me Portfolio**, if you are reflecting, do so in the "Reflection" area in the box containing your term goal.
- 5. Add ONE (1) Other Goal (short term) and include an Action Plan for how you intend to achieve it for Term 2. This can be about anything else in your life that you would like to improve on.
- 6. Add this goal to your About Me Portfolio.

NOTE: You will write a brief reflection about your goal achievement progress at the end of each term.

ACTIVITY #2: Occupation Investigation

- 1. Select Work section from the navigation menu on your dashboard, click on Occupations.
- **2.** Find an Occupation option by entering an **Occupation Name** of interest in the Search Bar and clicking **Search**. Too many options? Use the **Smart Filters** to help narrow your results. Be sure you look at the Education filter...choose **at least** one that requires college or university. You can even filter based on your salary desires. If you are unsure, try investigating careers *areas* that interest you. For example, look up "Career Clusters" Health Sciences for jobs in health but related to science education. This will give you a selection to choose from, remember this is research!
- 3. Find 3 Occupations that you want to learn more about. These occupations MUST BE DIFFERENT than the ones you chose in grade 9. Click the three dots to the right of the occupation names, select the Compare button and then click the blue Compare button at the top of the screen to view the Occupations side by side.
- 4. Consider and compare the following, complete the worksheet attached.
 - a. What do they do?
 - **b.** Level of education required.
 - c. Outlook?
 - d. Salary?
 - e. Describe the workplace.
 - f. Skill sets that you should possess.
 - g. Whether this job is a match for you based on your Who Am I results?
 - **h.** Requirements?
 - i. Potential Post-Secondary programs program name and institution
- 5. Click the heart icon below the Occupation Title to favourite attractive options.
- **6.** Repeat steps 2-5 for different Occupation options. Rank your top three choices by selecting **FAVOURITES** in the navigation menu. Click and drag your top three choices into the slots.



- **7.** Add boxes to your portfolio (About Me Portfolio) for your recently favourited occupations by clicking the three dots beside each name and selecting **Add to Portfolio**.
- 8. Add a **reflection** to each of the three boxes in **your Portfolio** (What is it about this occupation that interests me? What are the pros and cons of each one?)

HOMEWORK: Hand in your Occupational Investigation Chart to the Career Centre.

Do you have any Career Life Education experiences to add? If so, create a box in your **About Me Grade 10 Portfolio** and add a picture or symbol about your experience and add a reflection regarding your experience. **Hint:** Did you participate in any Career events; attend a presentation, go on a fieldtrip, job shadow?

Are you interested in any dual credit program? A trade like electrical, plumbing, carpentry, HVAC or welding? Or maybe becoming a Certified Education Assistant, Early Childhood Education, Emergency Responder Technician? If you have any questions or would like an application, stop by the Career Centre.

 - b. Location
 - c. Program name
 - d. What does the person do?
 - e. Program Length
 - f. Tuition cost
 - g. Is there residence/cost?
 - h. Admission requirements
 - i. Related Occupations do you like anything? This could be a comment in your reflections.
- **6.** In the navigation menu, select **FAVOURITES** and rank your top three post-Secondary opportunities by clicking and dragging them into the first, second, and third place spot.

- 3. Create a new resume or add to your resume from grade 9. If you haven't already, update or add your Contact information; fill in the Objective, Education, Work Experience, Skills and Abilities, and any other sections you feel you need. When you print your resume, it will only print what you have populated.
- **4.** You can "switch" the order of appearance of your sections....your objective should be first, followed by work education, work experience, skills, certificates, hobbies. **References** belong at the end and needs to complete do NOT insert "available upon request"
- 5. Please consider this a resume you are going to use to search for a summer job this spring. Be sure your objective is clear for your employer...do you want a fulltime summer job, or part time, an after-school job? What skills sets do you have that an employer would be interested in....do you have computer skills, can you use tools, do you have a driver's license?

HOMEWORK: Print a copy of your resume and hand it in to the Career Centre. Be sure the resume you hand in is one that is truly useable. Be sure you proofread!



MARCH

ACTIVITY #1:: Budget

- 1. Select Money from the navigation menu.
- 2. Click on **Budget and Finance Guide**, review the content in the "Income ad Expenses" and "Credit and Debt" sections.
- 3. Go "back" to Money, click add Budget.
- 4. Use the information below to **create a monthly budget** (remember a month is 4 weeks). Be sure you are paying close attention to the terms: weekly, monthly, annually.

Blake is a high school graduate who works part-time at Starbucks, earning \$250 a week. On top of this, they receive tips of \$85 a week. They also attend the local college, part time with tuition being \$800 for two semesters (but they won a \$400 bursary). They attend school from September to December, then January to April. From May to August they work full time, making \$1600 a month. They live at home at the moment in order to save money but do buy their own food that is on average \$400 a month. They spend \$50 a week on Amazon and \$40 on eating out; and \$30 a week for games, movies and other forms of entertainment. They also own a car which draws annual expenses of \$1500 for insurance and \$300 for maintenance, and weekly gas cost of \$40 for travel to and from school/work. For their phone and internet, they ar on the \$60 a month phone and internet bundle with unlimited use. They deposit whatever money they have left over into their savings bank account.

5. Add your budget to your grade 10 portfolio.
