Introduction to Career Education:	A person's career is considered their "journey" through life, and the Career Education curriculum offers students the opportunity to pursue this journey in personally meaningful and goal-oriented ways. Career-life development with intent is the ongoing process of self-discovery, growth in competence, and learning from experiences in educational, work-related, and personal life contexts. The Career Education curriculum supports students in becoming successful, educated citizens by helping them learn how to effectively manage their life journey toward preferred future possibilities. This area of learning requires students to identify and develop their personal interests, passions, and competencies. Students reflect on learning experiences in school and community, build confidence through their contributions, and explore multiple career-life roles and choices. The curriculum fosters lifelong learning, beginning in kindergarten and continuing through to graduation and beyond.

ACTIVITY #1: Interests Assessment

- **5.** Review the **full report** to learn more about your top two motivation factors and the types of opportunities that are well suited to your interests.
- 6. Add your Interests to your About Me Portfolio
- 7. Write a brief reflection (Do you agree? Disagree? Why or why not? What did you learn?).

- **6.** Add boxes to your portfolio (About Me Portfolio) for your recently favourited occupations by clicking the three dots beside each name and selecting **Add to Portfolio**, save to your grade 9 portfolio
- 7. Add a title (the job name) to each of the three boxes in your Portfolio and in the reflection area, rank you jobs from 1 to 3. (1 is awesome job, 2 is great job, 3 is ok job)

When you print your resume, it will only print what you have populated.
- 4. You can "switch" the order of appearance of your sections....your objective should be first, followed by work education, work experience, skills, certificates, hobbies. **References** belong at the end and needs to complete do NOT insert "available upon request"

MARCH

- 3. Go "back" to Money, click add Budget.
- **4.** Use the information below to **create a monthly budget** (remember a month is 4 weeks). Be sure you are paying close attention to the terms: weekly, monthly, annually.

Chris is a high school student who works part-time at the local fast-food restaurant, earning \$200 a week. On top of this, he receives an allowance of \$65 a week from his parents. He has moved out of home to live with his older brother, splitting the \$1800 a month rent between the two of them. He spends \$50 a week on food for his meals and \$20 on eating out; and \$20 a week for games, movies and other forms of entertainment. He also owns a car which draws annual expenses of \$300 for registration, \$1500 for insurance and \$200 for maintenance, and weekly gas cost of \$30 for travel to and from school. For his phone and internet, he is on the \$50 a month phone and internet bundle with unlimited use. For his electricity and water bills, Chris budgets for these by using the average figure from the previous year. His previous four quarterly electricity bills were \$150, \$120, \$140 and \$160, and his previous four quarterly water bills were \$100, \$80, \$90 and \$120. He deposits whatever money he has left over into his bank account.
